Notification of Extended Absences

Occasionally students will miss an extended period of time during the school term, including for family holidays or travel due to sporting commitments.

While we recognise that these trips offer a range of benefits for the mental health and wellbeing of students, along with an opportunity for them to broaden their horizons and gain new experiences, it is important to consider the impact of extended absences on schooling.

For that reason, when planning extended holidays during term time please contact your son's tutor teacher and classroom teachers as soon as practicable to advise them of the absence, as well as log the absence on PAM.

While there is no expectation that teachers will set work for students who are taking extended holidays, your son should speak with his teachers to discuss the material that will be covered, and he should expect to do some catch up work either before or after the trip to ensure that he doesn't fall behind with his learning.

Students who are absent for assessment tasks will receive an 'NA' for the assessment and may be able to redeem the task to meet the requirements for satisfactory completion of a unit of study.

Please also note that these holidays will be recorded as 'unauthorised absences', even though the student is missing school with parental permission. 'Unauthorised' refers to the fact that the absence is during the scheduled school times.

After parents and carers notify the College of extended absences via PAM, a template letter will be sent out reminding them of the expectations that students catch up on all set work, and noting that for reporting processes the absence is 'unauthorised'.

These letters serve as a reminder of the College's attendance policies, and should not be read as a criticism of the student's

work ethic or engagement. If you have questions about the absence, please contact your son's Tutor Teacher in the first instance.

We would like to extend our thanks for your participation in the recent VCE, ERPP/VCE VM student progress interviews. Your involvement and support are crucial in helping our students achieve their full potential.

Thank you for the continued partnership with your son's teachers and we look forward to seeing the continued growth and progress of our students in the coming months.

Families with sons who are not in VCE, VCE VM/ERPP will have their next opportunity for a student progress interview later this Term 3 on 7 September in person and 11 September online.

2024 Subject Selection Years 7 and 8

In Term 3, Years 7 and 8 students and their families select their elective subject choices for 2024. Changes to core subjects do not form part of subject selection and if your son is currently involved in a specialised program such as Intervention English or Maths, Altior, or Manchester City, then he will continue with this in 2024.

Students will be guided through this process during two Tutor Workshops and Assemblies on 21 July and 28 July. During these workshops, students will be shown information on the College's Subject Selection Website and will have an opportunity to discuss their potential elective choices.

Further information was emailed to families Wednesday 12 July.

Years 9 to 12

Year 9 and 10 students and parents intending to follow a VCE pathway in 2024 will be required to attend one of the three Subject Selection Information sessions and the VCE Expo on Thursday 20 July.

Current Year 11 and 12 students are encouraged to attend from 3.30pm to 4.30pm when they will have access to Parade College VCE and VET staff as well as representatives from a range of tertiary institutions. Year 9 students who have indicated their preference for the Edmund Rice Pathways Program (ERPP) in 2024 and current Year 10 ERPP students need not attend.





Year 12 Careers Meetings

VTAC

The Victorian Tertiary Admissions Centre (VTAC) is the central office that administers the application processes for places in tertiary courses, scholarships, and the Special Entry Access Scheme at universities, TAFEs, and independent tertiary colleges in Victoria (and a few outside Victoria). VTAC receives and forwards application information and supporting documentation to the relevant authorities at Institutions.

VTAC is not a selection authority, they do not determine the selection criteria used by Institutions, and do not decide who will receive an offer. All decisions about which applicants are offered a place are made by the course selection authorities at Institutions. After selection decisions have been made by the course selection authorities at Institutions, VTAC sends offer messages to successful applicants on the Institutions' behalf.

All students applying to most of the Tertiary Institutions, require a VTAC account. This is available to students from Monday 31 July and closes at 5.00pm on 28 September.

Students will be attending a presentation at school about how to set up an account and I have included a link for students to look at before the meeting. <u>https://www.vtac.edu.au/applying/account.html</u>

Year 10 Work Experience

Year 10 Work Experience is on between 13 November and 17 November 2023 and it is compulsory for all Year 10 students at the Bundoora Campus. Students are encouraged to organise their work placements and it would be great for them to work with family members, friends, local businesses, primary schools, etc.

I would highly recommend that students try to find a placement they are interested in as it may give them greater insight into pathway options for VCE and University. Students can collect a Work Experience form from their Careers teacher or the Careers Office.

ExCEL Career Voyager excursion to La Trobe University

On Wednesday 12 July Year 9, Career Voyager students visited La Trobe University as part of the Excel program. Students caught the tram from the Bundoora and Preston Campuses and walked with excitement and curiosity to meet the La Trobe staff outside the University library.

The boys were immediately overwhelmed by the size of the University and the many buildings that housed the different faculty areas. They were also very quick to spot the wide range of food eateries available. The groups were divided into two, and each participated in a Microbiology class and a University presentation about Food and Nutrition courses.

In the Microbiology session, students used microscopes to view bacteria from their mouths. This was done by scraping the inside of their cheek, putting the sample on clear film, adding dye to the film, and then viewing it through the microscope. Students thoroughly enjoyed their time in the University Science Laboratory and were extremely lucky to have this experience.

During the Food and Nutrition presentation, students learnt about the Bachelor of Nutrition course and further study in a Masters of Dietetics. Students asked questions about specific foods, and protein powders, and, one of the popular questions was, "Is breakfast really that important?" The answer to this was, Yes!

Students were then given a tour of the Business and Law building, where they were able to sit in the "Moot Courtroom" and we also managed to visit the new sports precinct. Unfortunately, we were not able to watch the Matilda's train, however, we did get a glimpse of the new facility.

The aim of the excursion was for students to be exposed to a University Campus and gain greater insight into possible future pathway options.

All Year 9 students will participate in the excursion over the next six weeks and each group will experience a different presentation. The upcoming group for Wednesday 19 July will be involved with the Archaeology and Law Faculties.

Getting the most out of an Open Day

Most institutional Open Days are held in late July and August (see over the page for Open Day dates). However, you are more than welcome to contact an institution to arrange a visit any time.

What happens on an Open Day?

On Open Day you can visit an institution when it's at its best. Everyone is there – academics, lecturers, current students, and information officers. More importantly, you can talk with academics, lecturers, and current students about what certain courses are actually like, and what is required to get into them.

Who should attend an Open Day?

Anyone who is considering studying at a tertiary level in the next few years should attend.

Why should you attend an Open Day?

Apart from the opportunity to obtain course information there are many other reasons why attending an Open Day is a good idea:

- You are going to feel more comfortable arriving at a university or TAFE institute on the first day of classes if you
 have been there before.
- What is really involved in the course or courses you are interested in?
- If you have to move away from home, where are you going to live?
- Will you be happier studying in a large metropolitan institution or a smaller, perhaps rural institution?
- What does the place 'feel' like? Is it a bustling environment with lots of activity or a quieter, more relaxed campus set in landscaped grounds?
- How are you going to get there? Is it close to public transport or should you start saving now for a car?

If you don't know the answers to any of these questions, then you should attend an Open Day!

How to make the best of Open Days

To make your Open Day visits fun and informative, here are some pointers:

- Write down a list of questions you would like to ask about particular courses.
- Be there early. Crowds tend to develop as the day progresses.
- On arrival, get a map from a central point and ask for directions to the relevant faculties or schools.
- Ask questions!
- Don't spend the day collecting printed information only. Use the opportunity to speak directly with academics before applications close.
- Introduce yourself to selection officers if you feel it is appropriate, but don't be pushy.
- Check out the residential colleges, if available. After all, it is you that will be living there.
- Walk around the campus. Have a good look! See what sporting facilities and other services are available.
- Enjoy the visit!

Not everyone can attend every Open Day and various Institutions hold their Open Days on the same date! If you can't attend an Open Day and you are interested in a particular institution, you may visit at other times. If you wish to speak to a particular person, it is essential to make an appointment first.

This information was correct at the time of publication. Students are encouraged to register soon for the online Open Day events so they can receive important updates. Students in Years 10, 11 and 12 are encouraged to participate in a few Open Days







Parade College Aboriginal Ties and Scarves

We are very proud to be able to offer the sale of the College Aboriginal Ties and Scarves to our College community.

Designed by Aboriginal Parade students in 2019 and approved with consultation by Wurundjeri Elder Auntie Di Kerr, they tell the Aboriginal story of the Parade College grounds, as told by Wurundjeri Elder Uncle Dave Wandin.

The circles represent the people who lived, cared for, farmed, hunted and travelled on this Country. Aboriginal people lived and met on this Country daily to hunt and sit under the big Red Gums they planted. They exchanged information about land management, what they saw on their daily walks, observed, ate and shared food, weaved and traded.

You can see the kangaroo tracks down the tie, representing the Kangaroos that lived on this land to feed and rest. The Aboriginal meaning of Bundoora is thought to mean where the kangaroos lived.

Ties and Scarves can be purchased from College Reception \$25 Tie, \$30 Silk Scarf, and \$20 Polyester Scarf

Students are able to wear the Aboriginal Tie in place of their College Tie during Terms 2 and 3
