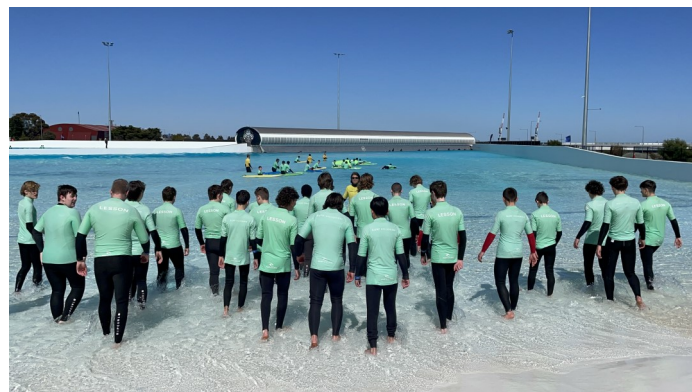
Our thoughts and gratitude are with them as they complete the final weeks at the College after our formal farewell to them at their graduation evening, *Valete*, a few weeks ago.

VCAA, VCE and VET Unit 3/4 Written Examinations

VCAA, VCE and VET Unit 3/4 written examinations continue until Wednesday 16 November. Students should consult their VCAA Exam Navigator which contains all rules and regulations regarding the exam period. An electronic copy is available at

Teachers will still be available for revision in timetabled classes right up until the scheduled subject exam in their usual timetabled classroom. We wish all students the very best for their continuing exams.

Class of 2022 VCAA Results

VCE and VCAL results will be released by VCAA at 7.00am on Monday 12 December. Details on obtaining results are available on the back page of the VCAA Navigator.

Student Wellbeing Support and Careers Counselling

The College will be offering both career counselling and emotional support from Monday 12 to Wednesday 14 December. More information was contained in the letter to VCE students that was included with the graduation certificates at the Valette Evening.

Accelerating Year 11 Students Involved in VCAA Exams

If a student has a Year 11 exam on the same day as their VCAA exam, the Year 11 exam will be rescheduled. Students need to meet with Mr Fahey (Dean of Learning Years 10 to 12) to arrange this.

Years 8, 9, 10 and 11 Semester 2 Examinations

Semester 2 examinations commence this week, dates and details are provided below. During the examination period, Year 10 and 11 students are not required to attend school other than for scheduled examinations. Correct summer uniform is required.

Supervised revision will be arranged for those attending school. Year 8 and 9 students attend as normal.

All students should commence examination revision. Students will receive revision materials to assist in their preparations.

Year 11:	2 November to 11 November
Year 10:	3 November to 11 November
Year 9:	15 November to 17 November
Year 8:	14 November to 17 November

Years 10 and 11 Examinations

Wednesday 2 November is a normal school day for Year 10 students. Year 10 exams precede a week of Work Experience from 14 November to 18 November.

Year 11 exams are followed by the compulsory Year 12 Commencement Camp at Phillip Island on 16 November to 18 November. Year 11 students are not required at school on Monday 14 November and Tuesday 15 November.

Years 8 and 9 Examinations

If a student is unable to attend an examination, it will not be possible to have the exam rescheduled.

Where a student misses an exam due to approved absence (eg; illness), then they will receive the grade 'X-Special Circumstance' for that task.

Students absent for an exam due to an approved school event (eg; ACC Sport) will be notified of an alternative time to sit the examination that was missed.

Years 8 to 12 2023 Commencement Classes

As the name suggests, all students continuing at Parade in 2023 are required to attend school for 2023 commencement classes. These classes will commence from Monday 21 November.

It is important to note that teachers will not reteach this information when school returns in 2023. As such, it is essential that all students attend.

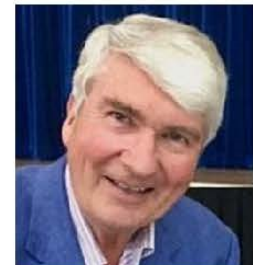

Frank Brennan is a Jesuit priest and Rector of Newman College at the University of Melbourne. He is a Distinguished Fellow of the PM Glynn Institute at Australian Catholic University, an Adjunct Professor at the Thomas More Law School at ACU and research professor at the Australian Centre for Christianity and Culture. He chaired the National Human Rights Consultation for the Rudd Government and was a member of the Turnbull Government's expert panel which conducted the Religious Freedom Review. The Morrison Government appointed him to the Voice Co-Design Senior Advisory Group to help guide the Co-Design process to develop options for an Indigenous voice to government. Frank serves on the boards of Jesuit Social Services and the National Apology Foundation for Indigenous Australians and on the Advisory Council of the Global Foundation. His research interests include conscience and faith, human rights and the rule of law, and the rights of Indigenous peoples and asylum seekers.

Pilot Human Rights Workshop for Secondary Students

On Friday 7 October, five Year 8 students from Parade were invited to participate in a pilot Human Rights Workshop at Melbourne Law School.

The aim of the workshop was to raise awareness about human rights among students with an interest in human rights and social justice issues. It also exposed students to a university learning environment and build common connections among those students who attended.

Students examined issues including statelessness, indigenous incarceration (especially for young people) and child labour. They then learned about the different ways young people are creating change and how they can make a difference.

Participants liked:

- Collating our ideas throughout the day and combining them to design our own social justice campaigns
- Interacting with the university students and tour of the university
- learning new ideas, discussing with others, and meeting new people
- 'Everything, it was a real eye-opener'

All agreed the experience developed their understanding of human rights issues and enjoyed the opportunity to discuss ideas with students from other schools. Our students represented Parade exceptionally well.

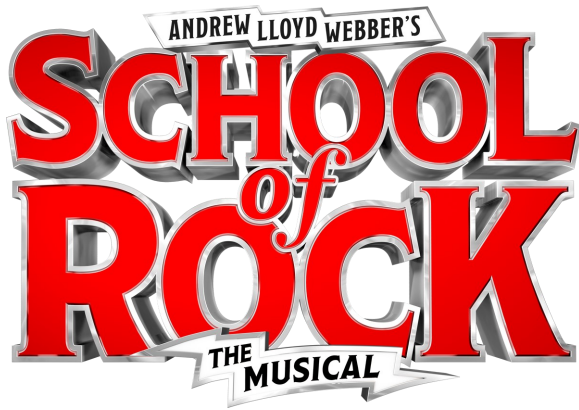

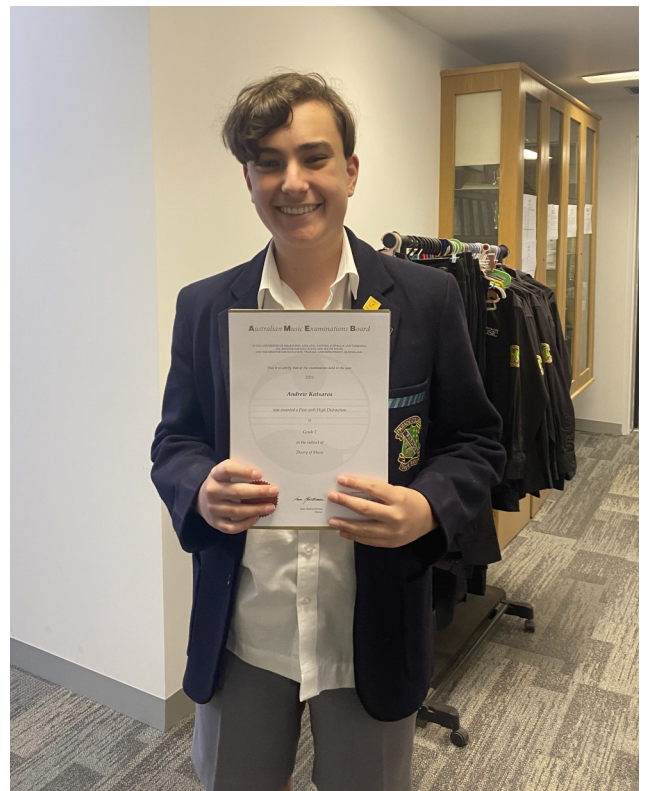

Annual Hall of Fame OPA Dinner

The Annual Hall of Fame OPA Dinner took place at the College in October. A wonderful celebration took place where Professor David Kissane and Collingwood Champion Peter McKenna were our most recent inductees to the Old Paradians Association hall of Fame.

Professor Kissane was Parade College Captain through the Bundoora campus's historic year of 1968. After studying Medicine at the University of Melbourne, David has forged an outstanding academic career in psychiatry, psycho-oncology researcher and author. He is internationally recognised for his research in his field.

He was honoured with the Companion of the Order of Australia (AC) in the General Division within the Australian honours with the citation, *"For eminent service to psychiatry, particularly psycho-oncology and palliative medicine, as an educator, researcher, author and clinician, and through executive roles with a range of national and international professional medical bodies"*

Peter McKenna attended Parade in Grade 3 at Flowerdale (Parade College Alphington) and concluded his time at Parade in 1963. Peter was able to forge a magnificent career in the Victorian Football League.

After making his senior debut in 1965, Peter became a champion full forward. He played 180 games for Collingwood kicking 838 goals, kicking over 100 goals in each of 1970 (143 goals), 1971 (134 goals) and 1972 (130 goals).

Peter won two Coleman Medals, all Australian honours and won Collingwood's best and fairest award, the Copeland Trophy in 1970.

Peter also played 11 games for Carlton (36 goals). Peter was inducted into the AFL Hall of Fame in 1999.

Peter is widely regarded as one of the best players of all time, but also the most popular footballer ever in the VFL. Peter is a proud Old Paradian.

Hall of Fame recipients Peter Bedford, Michael Drapac and Terry Moran were at the event to help celebrate our newest inductees.
