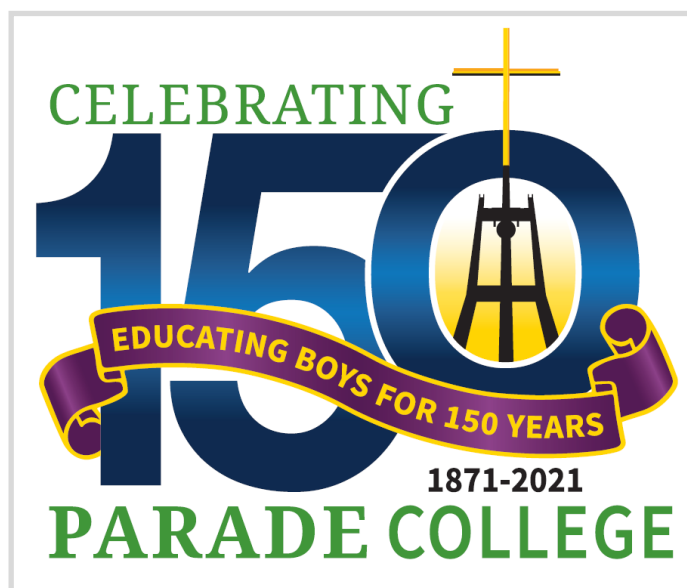

From the Deputy Principal

The students seem to have settled back into routine at school over the last couple of weeks, and it is certainly wonderful to have all the boys back with their energy and movement bringing life back to the College. They have certainly missed each other and the interactions with our staff.

We are noticing that some boys are tiring more quickly still, and to some extent that is to be expected for a little while yet, whilst body clocks adjust to school hours and travelling to and from school once again.

For the most part, too, the boys have been excellent about wearing their face masks at school, as per the directives from the State Government and based on the advice of the Victorian Chief Health Officer.

However, we need to ask for your help in reminding them that they need to wear their face masks, covering noses and mouths, to and from school – whether they are walking, on trams, trains or buses.

We are receiving an increasing number of calls and emails from members of the public, commenting that Parade students are wearing their masks on their chins, and in some cases not at all.

This is causing a significant degree of distress and anxiety in our wider community and our College has a responsibility, and is expected to assist in whatever ways we can, to keep our own community and our neighbourhood safe.

We know how generous and community-minded so many of our students are – and know too, that they would not wittingly want to upset anyone in our neighbourhoods, or even necessarily understand the level of anxiety and concern it causes some of our neighbours and members of the public when the boys don't have their masks covering their noses and mouths.



But it is up to us, the adults in their lives, to help them comprehend how their actions can be interpreted and read by others, especially those who don't know them as we do.

We ask you to please have this discussion with your son/s over the next few days.

And perhaps, along with lunches, homework and bags, remind your sons as they leave home in the morning to wear their masks.

We will of course continue to communicate with our boys on the most up to date directives as they are communicated to us by the State Government.

Year 11 Written Examinations

As advised in the last College Newsletter, the upcoming Year 11 examinations commence this week, from 19 to 27 November.

Full Summer College uniform is required. Supervised study halls will be operating for students choosing to remain at school outside their scheduled examination times.

Headstart Classes for 2021

Current Year 10 and 11 students enrolled in the VCE in 2021 will attend classes in their 2021 subjects in the final week of school, 30 November to 3 December.

VCAL Year 11 and Year 12 Sport Academy classes will also occur at this time at Bundoora.

Year 11 2021 VCAL Preston students will also undertake an orientation program in the final week.

All classes are a compulsory requirement for these current Year 10 and 11 students.

On 2 December Preston Year 9 students enrolled in Year 10 at the Bundoora campus next year will attend a session at Bundoora in the middle of the day, with transport provided where required.

Year 12 2021 VCE and VCAL Day at LaTrobe University

1 February 2021 promises to be a first day of school for all VCAL and VCE Year 12 students like no other.

While details of the day are in their final stages of planning, we have been able to secure authors and presenters for VCE English and Literature, for students seeking apprenticeships, in addition to sessions on time management, study skills and wellbeing.

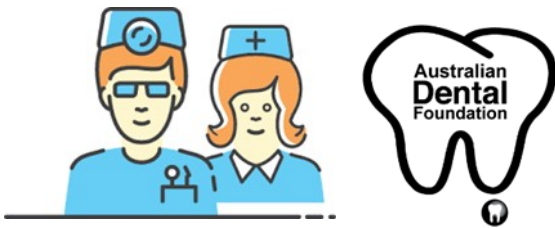

'My School Dentist' Program

The Australian Dental Foundation (ADF) is a charity, dedicated to improving oral health and expanding access to quality dental care for children and teens (2 to 17 years of age) across Australia.

The Foundation delivers the 'My School Dentist' program, a no out-of-pocket expense mobile dental program that delivers onsite oral health care and education for students at Primary Schools, Secondary Schools, Kindergartens, Child Care Centres and Out of Hours School Care. A qualified dentist and dental assistant provide the services below on site at school.



Since its beginning in 2012 the 'My School Dentist' program has provided services at hundreds of sites, improving the oral health of thousands of children and making our program the largest mobile dental service in Australia.

Services

What Treatment Can Be Provided Through the ADF Program? Your child's general dental care may include:

- an oral examination (minimum requirement); and, where clinically necessary, one or more of the following services:
- x-rays
- cleaning
- fluoride treatment
- dietary advice
- oral hygiene instruction
- follow up visits for general dental services such as fillings, fissure seals & extractions

Parade has just been invited to participate in this program from the beginning of 2021.

Your son will be provided with an Information Pack in Tutor Period on Friday November 20.


It will contain more detailed information as well as a consent card, should you wish to take advantage of this service and enrol your son in this program.

Please complete the consent card and get your son to return it to his Tutor Teacher by Friday 27 November.

It is anticipated that the first visits of the Mobile service to each campus in 2021 will be in late Term 1 - early Term 2 and then again in Term 3 next year.

2020 Community Action Annual Christmas Appeal



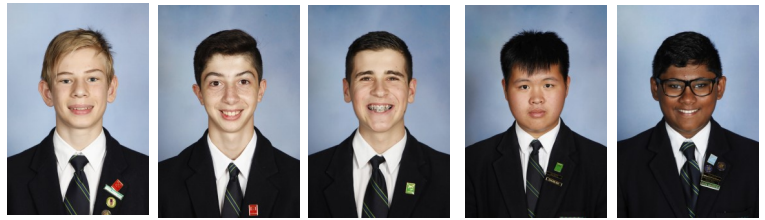

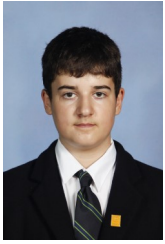

Indigenous Garden at Preston

You may have walked past the front of the Mackillop Building at the Preston Campus and noticed that the garden beds out the front are all the same; a tree or two and a bunch bushes or grasses that are not very interesting.

A few weeks ago, a group of students and Mr Williams set out to change this.



First, we dug out some of the spikey grasses (turns out that this is listed as an invasive weed), to make room for some new plants.

All of the new plants that we put in are native/Indigenous to this area and we chose these plants because we wanted to plant an Aboriginal/Indigenous garden.

There are a number of varieties of small trees which include Bottlebrush and Acacias; some small bushes, such as native Daisies and other flowers; and of course some native grasses called Kangaroo Paws which are beautiful grasses that produce red, green or yellow flowers. The flowers are unique as they do not have petals, instead they are a dense fuzzy looking flower that take on the distinct shape of a kangaroo's foot.



The garden still requires some more work, but hopefully soon, it will be fully complete and there for anyone who wants to admire it.

If you want to see this garden, it is located out the front of the Mackillop Building, Clifton Grove, Preston, facing Sacred Heart Primary School on the Preston Campus site.

2021 Instrumental Music Enrolments

Please refer to the plans below indicating the proposed changes. These changes are expected to occur over the coming weeks.

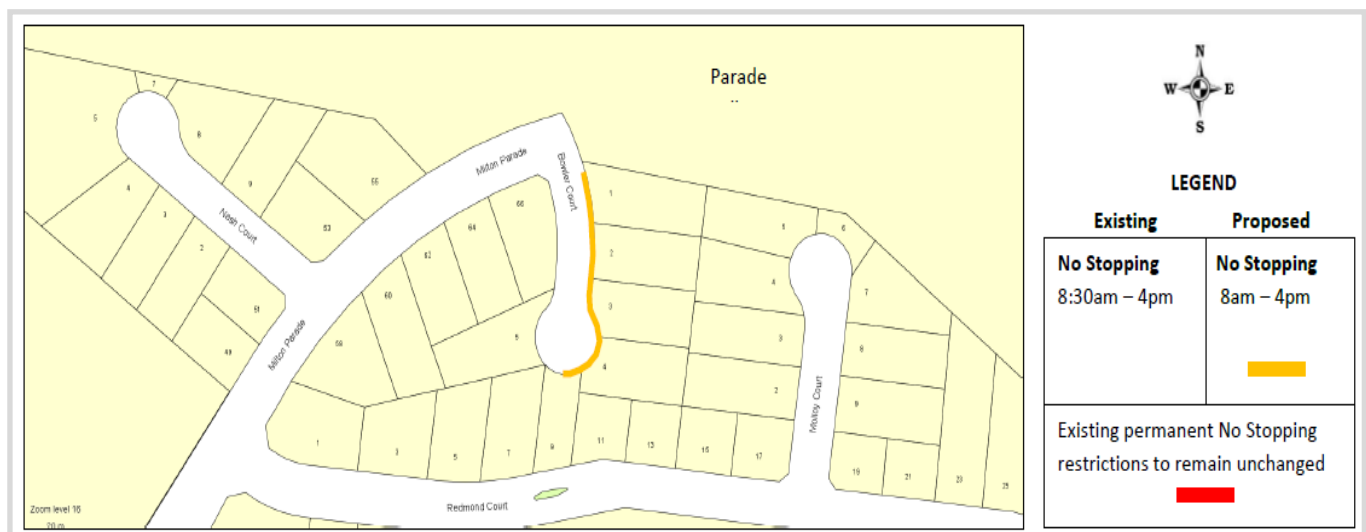
Please be advised that this change is not expected to have any adverse effects on parking in the area, as only the time is being adjusted to assist the school community.

University Terminology

When students are looking into university study, they often come across words or terms they are unfamiliar with. Here are a few of the more commonly used terms to help students understand what is being talked about.

Associate Degree

An associate degree is generally a two-year qualification that is made up of two-thirds of a bachelor degree and may be offered by both TAFEs and universities. Students often use this as a steppingstone to the full bachelor's degree.

ATAR

Australian Tertiary Admissions Rank – the figure used by UAC and VTAC to calculate the entrance ranking for a university course.

Bachelor Degree

The award/qualification a student gains when they have completed studies in an undergraduate course, which takes between three or four years of full-time study. This is the traditional starting point of a university qualification.

Bridging Course

An introductory course to help students achieve the preferred entry level to a degree, eg. a bridging maths course for students who do not have the preferred maths but need it to access a course.

Census Date

The last day a student can withdraw from their university course and not incur fees.

Commonwealth Supported Place (CSP)

A student's enrolment in a university degree for which the Commonwealth government makes a contribution towards the cost of that student's education (formerly known as a HECS place).

Double degree

A student can choose to complete a double degree – this integrates studies in two degrees resulting in an award of two degrees, usually after a minimum of four years of study. Often also referred to as *Combined Degrees*.

Defer

A student may choose to delay starting their course. Deferring an offer of a place might mean delaying for six, twelve, eighteen or twenty-four months. Deferment ensures the student is guaranteed their place in their selected course.

Honours

Many Bachelor degrees offer a fourth year – called an Honours year. The Honours year allows students to further focus on a particular area of interest. The Honours year can either be integrated into a four-year Bachelor degree or be offered as a separate year after completion of a three-year Bachelor degree.

Major Study

An area within a course that allows in-depth study in a particular field. More than one major may be allowed in some courses.

Minor Study

A grouping of subjects allowing a broader understanding of a few subjects, with less emphasis on in-depth study.

Prerequisite

A set of conditions – usually a completion of a subject – that must be met before enrolment in a subject or course is allowed.

Transcript

This is the university academic record each student receives, like a school report.

Undergraduate

A student studying at university for a first level degree, eg. a Bachelor degree.

The 2020 bus pass is valid for the beginning of 2021 until new student ID cards are issued during Term 1.

Timetables and Routes

Charter route A Timetable morning times has been adjusted due to changes in traffic. The new timetable is effective from the beginning of Term 4 2020, and is on the transport page of the College website.

Charter bus routes and timetables may alter before the beginning of the 2021 school year. Bus routes may change to best accommodate as many students as possible. The most up to date timetables are available on the transport page of College website.

Myki

Students using any PTV service including College PTV buses must carry and be able to present an in-credit MYKI card. Students are required to tap on at the beginning of each journey and tap off when alighting the bus at their destination. Visit the PTV website for MYKI information including setting up a MYKI account and topping up your MYKI account.

PTV Journey Planner

The Public Transport Victoria Journey Planner is a great resource for finding public transport options. This resource is highly recommended for;

- Students attending Preston campus. (great access to train/tram/bus)
- Students looking for options that may connect with the College Bus Network.
- Students from suburbs not catered for by the Parade College Bus Network
- Students who intend to use a College Bus service, but would like a possible Plan B.
- Students who may need to travel to a different location after school, for sport training etc.

College Bus FAQ's

I do not need the bus anymore; can I cancel it?

Yes, one term's notice is required in writing to cancel a bus service. Please contact the Logistics Coordinator.

I have lost my bus pass can I get a replacement?

Yes, replacement cards are available at a cost of \$7.00. Please contact the Logistics Coordinator to arrange a new card.

I haven't used the bus because of Government restrictions, will I have to pay for the bus?

If students are unable to use charter buses because of **Government Restrictions** families would not pay for that portion of the term.

I've lost my bus pass; how will I get home?

Arrange during the day for a temporary replacement via Student Reception. If it's too late to arrange this, explain to the bus duty staff or the bus driver that the pass was lost. You will be permitted to travel. Please arrange a replacement pass the following day.

I missed the bus. How will I get to school or home?

Families are advised to discuss a **plan B** for this scenario prior to the beginning of the school year.

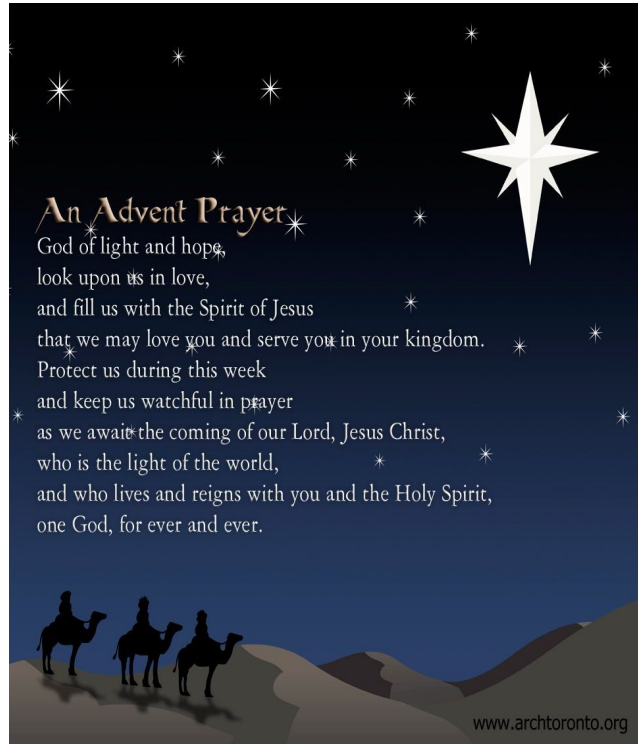
I left items on the bus, how can I get them back?

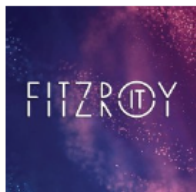

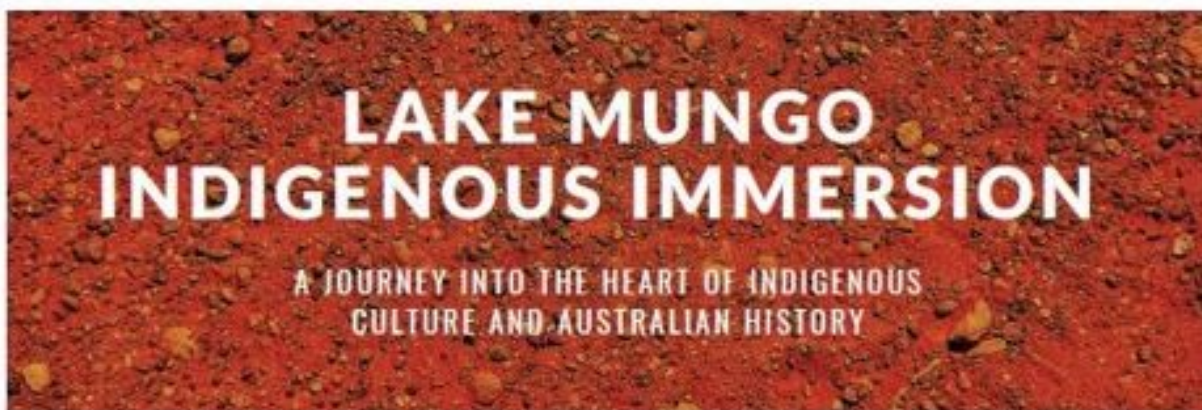
